"The Thing Itself" Written Assignment #2

When reading "The Thing Itself" by Bill Jay, I was able to understand more about my relationship to the subject matter I am photographing. Bill Jay speaks of the relationship between the camera and subject matter and how that can relate to the artist and how they develop their interest in the subject matter they photograph. He indicates that subject is one of the most important parts of a photograph and that we need to photograph what we have an interest in. Bill Jay asks what subject will be able to hold our attention and what will maintain our enthusiasm and tells readers that it is important to photograph what we are interested in. Selecting a subject is one of the most important jobs a photographer has. By choosing a specific subject, the photographer is saying to the viewers that they thought it to be the most important and interesting subject and that they greatly appreciate it. With some of my photographs for this assignment I have been going with the theme of darker, underneath, not as clean, and more abstract concerning the picture space. I have really enjoyed it because I am able to create more of a connection with my subjects because they aren't commonly photographed. I have also set up some scenes such as with Shannon in the slide holding up her camera. I have been working on developing more of a relationship with my subject matter and I am becoming fonder of my photographs as a result.

In this assignment, I have played around with shadows, darker images, and framing.
